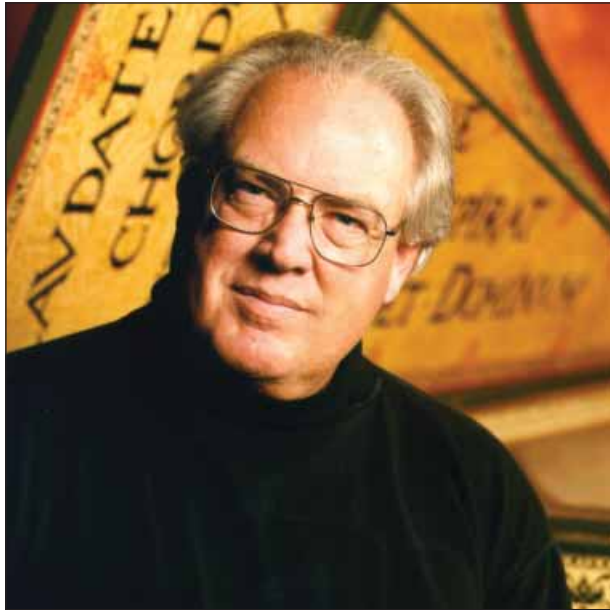

THE FESTIVAL



For one week in late June, the White Pine Festival blankets the St. Croix Valley with a moving tapestry of music, poetry and the visual arts, bringing world-class artists from multiple disciplines together to share their talents and perspectives with one another and festival participants in a wide range of entertaining and thought-provoking events.

Our 2009 artistic lineup unites a handful of festival favorites with one of the nation's hottest poets, Matthea Harvey, and retiring Minnesota Orchestra concertmaster Jorja Fleezanis, who has decided to make the White Pine Festival one of her last public performances in the region. Returning artists have embraced the festival's collaborative mission like never before; the result is a series of exhilarating and inventive performances you won't see anywhere else.

With a dozen events scheduled over five days, activities range from morning to night and have characters as diverse and interesting as the artists and audience members who participate in them.

All of this takes place amid the natural beauty and historic charm of the scenic St. Croix Valley, only 30 minutes east of Minneapolis / St. Paul.
